Brief History

The Bloomington Rotary Club was founded on March 12, 1915, just 10 years after Rotary International was established in Chicago in 1905. From the beginning, the focus of the Bloomington Rotary Club has been to serve the community with their mottos including “He Profits Most Who Serves Best” and “Service Above Self.” Throughout its history, the club has launched many service projects, including raising money for local nonprofits, donating books and other materials to local schools, and providing scholarships and awards to both students and educators. The Bloomington Rotary Club also hosts many events and fundraisers such as the annual Pork Chop Lunch which raises money for local service projects.

Throughout most of its history, Rotary Clubs only allowed men to become members. However, this changed in 1989 when Rotary’s Council on Legislation voted to admit women into Rotary Clubs across the globe. Two years earlier though, in 1987, the U.S. Supreme Court had ruled against gender-based membership. It was that year, 1987, that the Bloomington Rotary Club admitted their first female member, Dr. Holly Novak. Eight years later, in 1995, Sharon McGinnis became the first female president of the Bloomington Rotary Club.

The Bloomington Rotary Club is also a “singing club,” which means that music, singing, instruments, and songwriting play a large part in club meetings.

Scope

The collection is comprised of four boxes. Box 1 contains letters, membership and attendance information, financial documents, thank you cards, awards, programs, semi-annual reports, memorials, newspaper clippings, photographs, and other miscellaneous materials. Box 2 contains books and ledgers of meeting minutes from 1923 to 1989, as well as several groupings of papers from members that were kept in scrapbooks. Box 3 contains editions of *The Bloomington Cog* newsletter that date from 1926 to 1956, as well as roster books that date from 1919 to 2008. Box 4 contains editions of *The Bloomington Cog* that date from 1957 to 2003.
