Brief History

Vern Gray (December 19, 1897- June 28, 1972) was a former curator of the McLean County Historical Society. Gray became curator in April, 1965, when the museum was located in the McBarnes Memorial Building.

Gray lived in Bloomington since 1916, when his parents, James E. and Elvira Munro Gray moved from Saunemin, Livingston County, Illinois. Gray lived at 1209 E. Jefferson St. for more than fifty years. Gray's first job was teaching in a one-room school called Frog Alley near Towanda. He left in spring of 1917 to enlist in the army. He served overseas with the 33rd division. When he was discharged in 1917 he worked for oil drilling companies in Texas and Mexico, and worked on newspapers in Texas and Tennessee. He returned to Bloomington in 1929.

History was Vern Gray's main hobby and work. He spent much of his time refinishing old furniture and wood carvings. Gray was a member of Wesley United Methodist Church, Bloomington Masonic Lodge 43, Bloomington Consistory, American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Illinois State Historical Society, the McLean County Historical Society and the Smithsonian Associates, to name a few. Vern Gray died June 28, 1972 at the age of 74, after six months of failing health.
