History

Jonathon H. Kirkpatrick was born in North Liberty, Ohio in 1844. He moved to Bloomington with his widowed mother and seven siblings. He moved to Iowa to farm land and upon his mother's death, moved back to Bloomington and became a well known auctioneer. He is said to have "called" auctions for livestock, land, and personal property. He auctioned six thousand land and stock sales which netted \$16 million worth of sold merchandise. J.H. Kirkpatrick was elected Bloomington alderman, and was active in the Second Presbyterian Church, the Odd Fellows, and the Knights of Pythias. In the 1880s, Kirkpatrick opened a second-hand furniture store and in 1888, he took on a partner and the business was known as Howard-Kirkpatrick House Furnishing Co. The famous "Kirk's Red Chair" sat in front of this business for many years. This red chair is on display at the McLean County Museum of History.

Edward Kirkpatrick (1881-1968), Jonathon's son, became the manager of the Howard-Kirkpatrick House Furnishing Co. The partnership dissolved when Howard retired. Edward Kirkpatrick was very active in the Kiwanis Club in Bloomington by hosting many parties and fundraisers for the group.

Charles Kirkpatrick (1879-1971), Edward's brother, was gravely injured in a football game at Bloomington's Miller Park in October 1896. He suffered a fractured spine and was placed in a full body cast. He eventually recovered from the spinal injury and graduated from Bloomington High School in 1900. Charles attended the Eastman College of Business in Poughkeepsie, NY and graduated in 1901. He returned to Bloomington and tried several different occupations but all were too exhausting with his physical condition. He went to work at the Kirkpatrick Home Furnishing Store as the credit man. While working at the store, he attended the Bloomington Law School and Illinois Wesleyan University. Charles was chosen to be the President of the Alumni Association for Bloomington High School. He provided work for the YMCA and the Bloomington Consistory Club. He was appointed to the Federal Home Loan Bank Board in Washington DC. These opportunities provided Charles to throw parties, balls, and dinner parties. Many of these were fund raisers for World War II home front efforts. He served as the chairman for the Bloomington portion of the national celebration of the Northwest Territory Anniversary. He was also the director of the Blue Cross Plan for Hospital Care of Chicago and acting Chairman of the McLean County Chapter for Infantile Paralysis. He wrote many essays about Bloomington-Normal history and sports. He even provided his friends with sports riddles every year on the anniversary of his back injury.

Scope Note

This collection includes items from various members of the Kirkpatrick family, including J.H., Charles, and Edward R. Their items include essays, advertisements, newspaper articles, scrapbooks, and correspondence.
