## **Historical Sketch**

This collection consists of a series of albums and notebooks relating to Abraham Lincoln Elementary School in Bloomington.

The original school opened late in 1895, relieving other crowded public schools in the city. At the time it was the only modern school building because of its well-lit and ventilated interior rooms and exterior brick walls.

During the Great Depression, the federal Works Progress Administration (WPA) provided grants and bonds to fund school renovation and construction. A new Lincoln School was built with WPA support, and it remained an elementary school until it was closed in 1993. The building now serves as a "leisure center" for the City of Bloomington Parks and Recreation Department.

# **Scope and Content Note**

The Lincoln School collection consists mostly of photo albums of elementary school classes and the meeting minutes of the parent-teacher organizations. There are also numerous documents, including those on the history of Bloomington Public Schools; founders' day addresses and programs; and related newsletters.
