The Olde Towne Neighborhood Association was formed in 1997 as a non-profit organization. The general purpose of the association was to instill mutual respect and develop cooperation among neighbors in the common pursuit of good-quality life in a healthy and safe environment. Block leaders formed the Executive Committee which met bi-monthly, plus two general membership meetings annually.
