#### **Brief History**

In 1898, US President McKinley requested seven infantry regiments and one cavalry regiment from Illinois to fight what became known as the Spanish-American War. Bloomington sent "two troops of cavalry, one company of infantry, a company of colored infantry, and a number of men enlisted in various detached services." (*Pantagraph*, 4 Sep 1939)

In later years, several different Spanish American War Veterans groups were organized in Bloomington at different times and lasting for different periods. Some of the groups also had women's auxiliaries.

#### The organizations include:

- Soldiers of '98
- Worth Bagley Camp #180 of the national organization Spanish American War Veterans
- Geo. H. Ellis Camp No. 13 of the national organization Service Men of the Spanish War, later renamed the United Spanish War Veterans (USWV)
- Theodore Roosevelt Camp No. 7 of the USWV
- Russell. B. Harrison Camp No. 22 of the USWV
- James G. Harbord Camp No. 88. of the USWV
- General Lawton Camp No. 7 of the USWV.

A highlight of the local veterans' organizations history came in 1903 when the state encampment was held in Bloomington and then-US President Theodore Roosevelt spoke.
