Brief History

Henrietta Crain began her multi-year project to identify all current buildings in the town of McLean, Illinois, in the summer of 1984. It was a project to occupy her mind when her husband became ill, she said in a *Pantagraph* article (August 22, 2005). Her original goal was to discover who built the houses and when, and who has lived in them. Her methodology was to consult old *McLean Lens* issues from 1890 to the late 1940s when it ceased publication, cemetery books, and newspaper clippings from the *Pantagraph*. Also she interviewed many people personally and by telephone, as well as by letter. Throughout the years that this project entailed, Crain was helped by various people, whom she acknowledges in her “The McLean Homes,” the first item in this collection.

Henrietta Crain (1924-2019) moved to rural McLean in June 1948 when she married her husband, Claude W. Crain. She taught school for many years. In 1989, after her husband’s death, Crain moved to Normal, where she was living when she died May 5, 2019.

The town of McLean was laid out on June 22, 1855, by Franklin Price. McLean was laid out when the Alton and Springfield Railroad, soon to become the Alton Railroad, was first built through McLean County. McLean was incorporated as a village on May 29, 1866.

There had been an earlier attempt to found a town nearby. Mt. Hope, two miles east of McLean, was established in 1836 by the Providence Farmers and Mechanics Emigrating Society of Rhode Island, but the colony was unsuccessful. When the town of McLean was founded, the church building from Mt. Hope was moved into McLean. The first residents of McLean were the brothers G.L. and F.A. Wheelock, railroad employees, who moved into the new station house to conduct business. A blacksmith shop was the first business and H.H. Dillon built the first warehouse.

The design of the original town remains almost unaltered to this day from the original plans. The design was similar to other places along the Alton and Springfield Railroad including Normal, Towanda, Odell, and Dwight. The original town was basically a square with streets aligned north-south and east-west, split diagonally by the railroad with a line of lots paralleling either side of the tracks.

Scope

This collection includes a minimum of one page on each property in the Village of McLean. Information typically includes photograph(s) taken by H. Crain or from the newspaper, and notes about the property and history of its owners/residents. For some there are newspaper clippings or snippets about the property or owners. Interspersed throughout are maps drawn by H. Crain from the Plat Map of McLean. Some maps identify owners current at the time of her research.

Folder Inventory

Material on individual properties is organized by location identification + block number using the town map found in Folder 1. In order to find a specific property/address, find it on the map, note the location (Original Town or name of addition) and the block number. Material on that property is in the folder so labeled. Alternatively, since addresses are itemized in this finding aid, simply execute a “Find” command (Ctrl + F) to search. Some community/public buildings are listed by name, not street address, so use “Find” to locate correct folder.
